

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Academic Highlights

Bamboo Workshop: Hands-On Learning

The Green Building elective third-year and second-year students featured a hands-on Bamboo workshop led by field expert Mr. Rajendra Sapkal at SOA. The workshop spanned two days, held on September 8th and 11th, 2023. Students from Studio 20 (Third Year) and Studio 21 (Second Year) were bamboo's introduced to role structural systems within buildings, gaining insights into its advantages and limitations.

Key Highlights:

On Day 1, students were acquainted with various types of bamboo and the treatment process, covering everything from cutting to seasoning. They also learned to create diverse weaving patterns and mats.

Day 2 saw students engaging in more intricate projects, crafting interior artifacts such as lamps, pen stands, bowls, and more.







IMD Field Trip: Exploring Environmental Instruments

A field trip was organized for F. Y. B. Arch. Studio 23 and F. Y. M. Arch. ENS 23 at the Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) in Shivajinagar, Pune, on January 17th, 2024. The purpose of this visit was to familiarize students with various environmental measuring instruments as part of the Climate Responsive Building Design Principle Subject.

Key Highlights: During the visit, students explored three sections:

- **Surface Laboratory:** They witnessed demonstrations of different environmental measuring instruments and received relevant information.
- **Seismological Observatory:** Students observed demonstrations of seismic instruments and received information.
- Observatory/AWS
 (Automatic Weather Station): They
 witnessed demonstrations of various
 environmental measuring instruments
 in a large open area and received
 detailed information. Additionally,
 students had the opportunity to ask
 questions, which were addressed by
 the respective personnel in charge.







Workshop on Energy Simulation

DY Patil School of Architecture, hosted a Two-Day Physical Hands-on Training Program titled "Energy Simulation" on January 30th & 31st, 2024. The workshop, conducted by the Administrative Staff College of India (ASCI) in collaboration with the Maharashtra Energy Development Agency (MEDA) and with support from the Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE), featured ECBC Master Trainer Mr. Jitendra K. Vyas. Mr. Vyas, a certified ECBC Master Trainer by BEE, provided insights into energy simulation techniques using e-quest software.

Key Highlights:

The training program introduced ECBC 2017 and guided participants through the energy simulation process. Attendees gained knowledge energy-compliant buildings, modeling, optimization of building envelopes, and more. The event was attended by 41 participants, including faculty and students from B.Arch and M.Arch (Env.) and students of other architecture colleges of and engineering, and green consultants.







3D Printing Workshop

This immersive experience only not expanded their understanding automotive engineering but also cultivated a deeper appreciation for the collaborative effort and creativity driving progress in the field.

Rhythm Instrument Recording Workshop

The School of Film and Media organized a workshop focused on "Recording **Different Rhythm Instruments"** for its BSc. Sound Engineering students. Renowned percussionist Abhay Ingale conducted the workshop, showcasing the recording techniques for various rhythm instruments such as Tabla. Dholak, Duff, Diembe. Drumset, Darbuka. Morsing, Shakers. Tambourine, Dimdi, Bagalbaccha, and more. The expert demonstrated the use of different microphones and their applications, emphasizing the impact of polar patterns on recording rhythm instruments and providing guidance on selecting the appropriate microphone each instrument. demonstrations of each instrument were conducted, along with discussions on optimal microphone placement to capture the best sound quality.

Additionally, the importance suitable recording environment was explained, along with insights into the signal chain, including preamps, compressors, and equalizers. and troubleshooting techniques for potential challenges. The workshop took place on February 7th, with a total of 37 sound engineering students participating.



Journalism Students Engage in PhotoWalk Workshop



Students Achievements Internship Achievement: Ajay Dalvi's Success

DYPatil School of Architecture. conducted a collaborative studio for Third Year Studio 21 students under the mentorship of Ar Sanjay Prakash and Ar. Mayank Mishra, Shift Studio for the Architectural Design-IV project of the Sports and recreational club at Pashan. The project was selected under the Public Buildings category. The studio collaborated with six other colleges in India where they understood the thought process and got insights into projects from the mentor, they also got an opportunity to see and learn from other colleges. The discussions with the mentor were conducted in an Online mode where participating colleges presented. All the students uploaded their work as per the schedule and one folio from each college was chosen to be presented. The students worked under the guidance of the faculty (offline platform) and received input and feedback from the mentors. A total 27 number of students participated. The students worked individually, and six entries were sent for the Transparence Competition by Saint Gobain.

Key Highlights:

All Third Year Studio 21 students enthusiastically participated in the competition on a global level. A session was conducted for faculty orientation where three of our SOA faculties participated, reviewed, and gave



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
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
